

OVERVIEWWhy Debt Cancellation?

During the Global Week of Action for Debt Cancellation (10th-17th October 2020), young women in Malawi and allies joined organizations and citizen groups in the global movement to raise awareness of the urgency of the debt issue and to call for debt cancellation, including debt held by international institutions and private creditors.

The Objectives of this campaign were aligned to the young women's call for "a strongly funded public services sector and delivery of gender responsive public services"- a vision that is currently hindered by the stock of Malawi's public debt.

Malawi's fiscal deficit is above SADC set threshold of 4% of GDP and the debt stock has astronomically increased by nearly three quarters over the past 5 years from 2.41 trillion Mwk in 2016 to 4.1 trillion Mwk in 2020 .

The 2020/2021 national budget shows that the Government of Malawi will be unable to effectively support people due to debt payments as it will spend more money (17%) on debt payments to rich governments or foreign lender institutions than in healthcare or other key public services.

This first edition of "Public Debt Newsletter" Feminist macro-Economic Alliance - Malawi therefore provides highlights of key interventions implemented in during the week.



A CALL TO ACTION

Feminist Macro-Economics movement in Malawi implemented several interventions in the period before and during Global Week of Action for Debt Cancellation to mark the launch of the week and also to mobilize the public to join the many activities planned for the week or organize their own activities in support of the debt cancellation campaign.

Open Letter addressed to All Governments, International Institutions and Lenders

A key highlight of the week was an Open Letter addressed to All Governments, International Institutions and Lenders.

The open letter, read by ActionAid and signed by Feminist Macro Economics Alliance- Malawi (FEAM) members was delivered during a press briefing to ask international lender institutions to unconditionally cancel Malawi's external debt.


The letter's message made a big impact—both in terms of the message to make sure that voices from young women and people of Malawi are heard as well as the breadth and number of signatories from among organizations, movements, citizens groups and public leaders.
